Féileacán Teacher Duties

1. Be responsible for preparation and delivery of sessions using the Waldorf approach to children in the assigned class; using appropriate methods, e.g. using head, heart and hands approach. To provide balanced activities at a pace suitable to the children's age and development, based on a deep understanding of Waldorf pedagogy/child development, with a commitment to exploring and developing compatible innovative educational practice and initiatives found locally and across the globe.
2. To represent and uphold the Waldorf ethos in all dealings with children, parents, prospective parents, the public and official bodies.
3. To practice observation of the children in your care, seek to understand them, and work creatively to nurture the healthy development of their physical, social, emotional and

cognitive capacities, understanding their strengths and weaknesses and structuring work accordingly.

4. To engage in pedagogical study/discussion and child observation with colleagues and take a proactive and compassionate approach to addressing areas of concern/need.
5. To undertake appropriate preparation, as necessary both for the effective delivery of the job and to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives; to engage in personal reflection and self-development; and to commit to deepening your understanding of Anthroposophy and Steiner Waldorf education work
6. Where difficulties in any area are observed, develop appropriate strategies in consultation with other teachers if necessary. Make written notes of any critical incidents that occur. Keep parents informed of relevant items re behaviour, performance, accidents and incidents.
7. To develop the children's capacity for critical thinking and problem solving, perseverance, curiosity and independence.
8. To lead and inspire the children, maintaining good discipline and holding boundaries assertively, developing children's confidence and ensuring that effective learning/play can take place in the class.
9. To cultivate and nourish in the children a sense of wonder and reverence, leading by example.
10. To maintain the classroom/outside area to a high standard of cleanliness, order and beauty suitable to the tasks to be undertaken, modelling care for one's environment and involving the children appropriately.
11. To liaise with subject teachers and facilitate class screening when appropriate.
12. To prepare the class for festivals.
13. To organise and participate in class outings, trips and events.
14. To keep appropriate records, keep pupil files up to date and record and file all conversations with parents.
15. To participate in the admissions process for new pupils, meeting with prospective parents and children.
16. Continuous Personal Professional and Development: It is expected that the Féilecán teacher will continue to develop their knowledge in Waldorf educational methods and approaches, the anthroposophical understanding of the human being and the related process of child development. This may involve attending relevant courses and trainings as determined necessary by mentor and teachers group. Financial support for such trainings to be discussed with Finance Group. A general review will take place annually or as deemed necessary.

General Duties

1. To receive assistance, when appropriate, from a more experienced colleague or a specialist teacher in those areas in which you are less qualified/experienced.
2. To provide mentorship where required.
3. To take part in the appraisal of your own work performance .
4. To organise materials for class use and liaise with those responsible for purchase.
5. To monitor and keep within agreed budgets.
6. To attend staff meetings when requested
7. To attend out of school hours meetings when necessary.
8. To attend training courses and training days, as required.

9. To participate in school events during school holidays or weekends, as required.
10. To take on administrative tasks when inspired or required.
11. To familiarise yourself with and adhere to the School's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including the Equal Opportunities and Health and Safety policies.
12. To cover for absent colleagues as requested and able (i.e. supply cover).
13. To share responsibility for supervision of all pupils during non-class hours within the school day.
14. To undertake break-time duties.
